Where was the Program held?

BIRDS, Bangalore, India

BIRDS is an official social work organ of the **Sacred Heart Brothers Society**, which belongs to the congregation of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart. Established in the year 1997 to reach out to the poor and needy in remote parts of rural Bangalore, BIRDS is working among 100 poor and neglected villages of rural Bangalore, facilitating improvement in the quality of life of the women, youth and children from marginalized and oppressed communities. Completing one decade of dedicated service, BIRDS has created a silent impact on the lives of the poor.

International Women's Day Celebration

After the Delhi atrocity, the media started to highlight the violence against women in India. Every day there will be some or other news related to women's rights violation in India. So the International Women's Day was celebrated by many organization in India in an awareness way. 
Who are the Participants?

The Program Outline

PowerPoint presentation was used throughout the 2-day program, to allow participants a better grasp of HR concepts, UN literature, etc.

The first day program includes...

Inaugural Celebration & Women's Day celebration, (See:- Video)
Introduction about IARF, RFYN, UN
Three Documentaries & discussion on UDHR
Ice-breaking sessions

The second day program contains the sharing of Current Human Rights issues and stories, practicing UDHR to bring peace and harmony among the religions and in the society and also the future plan.

Stories Shared

1. Caste Discrimination: One of the participants Mr. Ajay, shared a story about caste discrimination in his village. He is from a high caste family and in his village there are many Dalit and Tribal who are considered as low caste communities also living in the corner of the village. The low caste communities are suppressed and treated very badly by the high caste community. Seeing this he decided to bring changes in the village a planned to eradicate the caste discriminations in the village. So he invited the poor and marginalised communities to his house for a dinner, through the low caste community afraid of the upper caste, accepting his invitation they attend the dinner provided by him. Many whispered bad about him, but he did not give up and continually did this to the poor and brought changes to the village. Now in that village there are no caste discriminations and all are living happy life.

2. Violence against women: One of the NGOs representative shared a story happed in her life. One day she was walking in the Bangalore railways station, there she found 19 years old girl was crying and no one is there to help her. She went to the girl and asked her what happen. The girl said, she was taken by some guys for giving job at Bangalore. When they found a police man they left the girl and run away. The girl was not having anything to go back to her house. Then she took the girl to her organisation and made her to stay three days, and then she phoned to her parents and took her to her parents.

Through this event IARF's young adults in Bangalore and the surrounding region established a very solid platform for cooperating on joint human rights programs with various local NGOs and future social workers. Two very inspiring future plans were proposed by participants: in collaboration with NGOs, offering Trainings of Trainers (ToTs) for their staff, and then organising HRE&T programs for their target groups; and in collaboration with the Master's students, organising HRE&T programs in rural communities. The NGOs agreed to the sharing of the programs' costs.

The organising team sent the invitation to 25 NGOs and 7 colleges in Bangalore for this program. They requested a registration fee of Rs200 per participant, and BIRDS and AESDS came forward in support of the remaining costs.
