

The two days program was in PPT presentation. The first day program included about IARF, RFYN, UN, Three Documentaries, & UDHR. ([See the Video](#))



The second day program contains the sharing of current Human Rights issues and stories, practicing UDHR to bring peace and harmony among the religions and in the society.

Issues Discussed

- Child Labour:** It is reported that out of the 60 million child labour in India, 40 % come from SC families. Moreover, it is estimated that 80 % of child labour engaged in carpet, matchstick and firecracker industries come from scheduled caste backgrounds. The tanning, colouring and leather processing, lifting dead animals, clearing human excreta, cleaning soiled clothes, collection of waste in slaughter houses and sale of toddy are some of the hereditary jobs generally pursued by Dalit children. They are not allowed to study. Example: the place Sivakasi, the whole children in that area are sent to crack industries and every year around 10-15 children affect with many deceases. - Girl Child Killing:** girl child killing is become a daily news in Indian the rural areas. If the family is having a girl child the society things the family will be facing economical problems. When the gird get marriage the parents has to give more dowry to the bridegroom.
