## Violence of ISIL attacks Religious Freedom

The Congress of the **International Association for Religious Freedom (IARF)** calls for united action against the greatest current threat to religious freedom.

In a statement titled "Not in our name", the Muslim Council of Britain, declares:

The Muslim Council of Britain once again condemns the action of the so-called Islamic State in Syria and the Levant, ISIL.... We are horrified at the abhorrent murder of James Foley, a reporter who initially went to the region to expose human rights abuses of the Syrian regime... We urge Muslim communities to redouble their efforts in coming together, condemning the barbarity of ISIS.

In our midst we have many representatives of other religious groups reporting violations of Article 18 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

The Congress believes: "There is no freedom without responsibility", and these continuing attacks on Human Rights – and especially those on minorities throughout the world – are a threat to religious freedom and all humanity.

Let us respond to these attacks with both action and compassion, so that Religious Freedom becomes a reality, Peace may prevail on earth, and everyman will be free.
